

Report of EC meeting held on 15 - 18 of November 2012, in Valencia

EAWOP's Executive Committee (EC) met and discussed the following issues in the meeting held in May, 15th to 18th:

- Organizational and scientific aspects of the 2013 EAWOP Congress in Munster were discussed.
- Information about the 2015 EAWOP Congress was shared and the contract between EAWOP and NPA was signed.
- Organization of sending out bids for the 2017 EAWOP Congress was planned.
- State of the art on the EAWOP website was presented and discussed.
- A state of art on EWOP in Practice was discussed.
- The situation of EJWOP and OPR was presented and discussed. A preliminary discussion on EAWOP members' access to papers was held.
- Constituent matters were presented. Two new constituents in waiting were presented (Slovenia and France).
- A proposal for EAWOP to participate in a Standing Committee on Work and Organizational Psychology by EFPA is discussed.
- Relations to other organizations were discussed. Discussions on the Alliance of Organizational Psychology were post-poned to the EC meeting in April 2013.
- A state of the art about Specialist Certificate in WO Psychology was reported.
- The organization of the 2012 summer school was evaluated and the next 2014 summer school was discussed.
- The EC accepts four applications for 2013 Small Group Meetings and approves to make a topical call for one SGM on "How WOP can facilitate economic recovery" in 2014.
- The organization of the "2012 Worklab" for practitioners was evaluated.
- The participation of EAWOP in the European Congress of Psychology in Stockholm was discussed.
- Possibilities for providing an overview and information on EU calls to EAWOP members are discussed.
- EAWOP nominations and procedure for nominations to the Aristotle Prize is discussed.
- The financial reports of 2011 and 2012 were not fully updated and thus the revision was postponed to the EC meeting in April 2013.
- The practicalities and statute related issues in relation to the EAWOP legal status situation were discussed.
- 20 new members were approved.
